Tree Planting

Yore Vision's latest tree planting has been in Great and Little Ouseburn. Wherever possible we are planting native trees. In Great Ouseburn native trees include oak, ash, wild cherry, alder, birch and sweet chestnut. Before any trees are planted Yore Vision gets advice from Harrogate Borough Council's tree specialist – and each site has to get a NYCC licence to plant the trees. If you would like to plant trees in your village please get in touch with Yore Vision.

Planting was delayed by the winter weather. In the photos you can see the river level behind the men planting the trees, the extent of the site and the way the trees have been supported.
